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#### TEST-TAKING ATTITUDE

Faking good attempts are about average. There is some likelihood of the presence of a response set in this person to try to look bad deliberately and to exaggerate anxiety symptoms for some reason. It is doubtful that he read the items carefully and understood what was required. The random index is elevated. Consequently, the validity of the entire profile must be questioned.

## PERSONALITY CAPSULE DESCRIPTION

He appears to be suffering from an unusually high level of free-floating anxiety, restlessness, and irritability, which may be interfering with his functioning efficiency. He shows very little warmth; indeed, he is markedly reserved. He probably has a history of a "burnt-child" reaction, that is, of unsatisfactory relationships with others and marked difficulty in gratifying his dependency needs. His capacity for abstract verbal skills appears to be high. He tends to be such a serious, responsible, and sober person that an early family climate is suggested where strong superego demands were made with relatively little dependency gratification. He is an unusually timid, shy, and restrained person. Consequently, there are indications that interaction with others is very difficult for him. He's a great deal more tender-minded and emotionally sensitive than others and is apt to be more vulnerable to stress than his peers. He tends to displace and project his emotions heavily. This indicates anxious insecurity, and suggests that he does not usually relate well to people. He appears to be especially guilt prone and likely to worry unnecessarily at times. He shows high reliance on obsessive-compulsive defense mechanisms and is able to bind his anxiety.

He is a dominant person, and probably needs to be in some position of authority in his worklife in order to function comfortably. He is somewhat below average in his concern for the standards of society and in group conformity and conventionality, but not markedly so. This is not a person who gets carried away with his fantasies. Instead he is a practical down-to-earth person who can be counted on to attend to details. High independent self-sufficiency is indicated, which is probably reflected in good work habits.
